Pipeline Safety is Everyone's business!

Our most important goal is to safeguard everyone who lives and works along our distribution pipeline. We take great care to install, operate and maintain our system in the safest manner possible.

Despite all our safeguards, however, emergencies occur, primarily through outside forces, such as damage by persons working near our lines. So, we need your cooperation to prevent accidents and emergencies from happening.



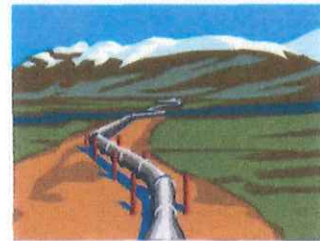
Help prevent pipeline accidents:

- * Call **BEFORE** you dig, drill, blast or doze....
- * Watch for signs at road, railroad, and river crossings, at fence lines and other sites.

Signs of a pipeline emergency and/or leak:

- * Strong gas odor.
- * Hissing sound.
- * Unusual blowing.
- * Bubbles in water.
- * Dying plants.
- * Fire or explosion near a pipeline.



Steps to take in a pipeline emergency:

- * Call the City of George West 24-hour emergency number immediately.
- * Avoid potential ignition sources.
- * Warn others to stay away.
